HARLAN - Lloyd Joseph Sick, son of Frank and Tena (Clementine Meier) Sick, was born July 25, 1931, in Fairview Township, Shelby Co. He was baptized Dec. 27, 1931, at Avoca. He attended Shelby County Schools, Kirkman School and graduated from Harlan High School in 1949.

Jan. 23, 1954, he married Lois Jean Best at the Tennant Methodist Church. They have two sons, Jim and Frank. He served in the United States Navy, 1951 to 1955, during that time he served two years in Cubic Bay, Philippines. Since his discharge they have made their home in Harlan. During those first years after the service he was employed at Schack Furniture, Gambles Store and Modern Skelgas for Al Goodmanson. He was then owner of S & S Skelly Service for approximately 10 years. He was transportation supervisor for Harlan Community Schools for several years and has driven school buses since 1962. It was always a joy to him to drive these kids to school. He even drove the first two days of school this year. He was also employed by Harlan Mfg. Company and Jacobs Corporation retiring January 1994. He was a life member of the Shelby County V.F.W. Post No. 941 and was also a member of the Harlan Volunteer Fire Dept. for 22 years and then was an honorary member. Oct. 3, 1998, he died at Clarkson Hospital in Omaha, NE, as the result of cancer at age 67 years, two months and nine days.

He is preceded in death by his parents; sisters, Arlene Stinn and Emma Schneckloth. He is survived by his wife, Lois of Harlan; sons, James Arden Sick (Vonnie) of Sacramento, CA and Franklin Duane Sick of Harlan; his grandchildren, Tawnya Sick, Holly Sick and Joshua Sick of Sacramento, CA; great granddaughter, Hayley Ra Nae Polk of Sacramento, CA; his sisters, Doris (Bernard) Stinn of Harlan; Frances (Lawrence) Pauley of Harlan and Ruth (Roy) Fries also of Harlan; nieces, nephews and other relatives.

Funeral services were held Oct. 6, 1998, at Pauley Funeral Home with Pastor Jon Benson of the Immanuel Lutheran Church in Harlan officiating. Military rites were conducted in the Shelby Cemetery by the Shelby County V.F.W. Post No. 941 and the Harlan American Legion - Helmer Reyelt Post No. 150.
