

Le Neita Stamp, 70

Sept. 11, 1930 – Jan. 31, 2001

LONGMONT, CO – Le Neita Jean Stamp, 70, of Longmont, CO, died Jan. 31, 2001, at her home. She was born Sept. 11, 1930, at Dysart, the daughter of Leonard Lee and Florence (Stoakes) Reigle. She graduated from Traer school in 1947, and Iowa State University, Ames in December 1950.

She was a home economist for Butler County at Allison and in Council Bluffs until her marriage to James E. Stamp May 5, 1956 in Council Bluffs. They farmed near Persia until 1961, when they moved to Denver then to Broomfield, Longmont and later to Fort Collins. She owned and managed commercial property in Loveland for 30 years. She was a member of Friends of the Library in Longmont and Fort Collins. Also a 4-H leader and delivered Easter baskets for many years to Senior Citizens through the 4-H project known as Operation Easter Bunny. She was active in the American Association of University Women and its bookfair. She was a longtime member of Bible Study Fellowship and was the BSF Grandma. She belonged to Christ Our Savior Lutheran Church teaching Sunday School and Child Evangelism.

She was preceded in death by her husband in 1990; a brother-in-law, Fred Stamp and his wife, Marilyn, and a sister, Mary Sterling. Survivors are two sons, Robert (Lora) Stamp of Longmont and Jeff (Teresa) Stamp of Mead; three daughters, Linda (Dana) Sundberg of Arlington, VA; Allela (Rodney) Baltes, Riverton, WY and Amy Jean Stamp, Longmont; a brother, Russ (Jo) Reigle of Brighton; two sisters, Dorothy (Tom) Buxton of Wiley, CO and Evie (John) Coie, Fairfax, VA; 10 grandchildren, Adam, Emily and Zac Stamp; Amanda, Amber and Andrew Baltes; Kimberly, Jillian, Christina and Rebecca Stamp, and other relatives.
