

Anna Stinn, 97

Jan. 17, 1900 - Nov. 28, 1997

EARLING - Anna Elizabeth Stinn, daughter of Fred and Catherine (Stauder) Hoehn, was born Jan. 17, 1900, at Witt, IL. Her mother died when she was four years old and she and her brother went to live with her Hoehn grandparents. Anna attended grade school in Witt, IL.

Jan. 4, 1921, she married Fred A. Stinn at Witt, IL. To this union eight children were born. They lived on area farms before moving into Earling in 1949. After the death of Fred May 2, 1963, Anna continued to live in her own home. She was a longtime member of St. Joseph's Catholic Church in Earling and a member of the Catholic Daughters of the Americas Court of St. Katherine No. 266 of Earling, holding several offices including Regent. She was also a member of St. Joseph's Altar Society. She became a resident of Little Flower Haven in 1992 and it was there that she died Nov. 28, 1997, at age 97 years, 10 months and 11 days.

In addition to her parents and her husband, Fred, she was preceded in death by her son, Cletus, March 25, 1946, and her brothers, William and Leo Hoehn. Survivors include her children, Catherine Gubbeis (Pete) of Harlan; Helen Langenfeld (Mark) of Earling; Bernadine Stoltenberg of Omaha; Regina Koesters of Earling; Leonard Stinn (Connie) of Dunlap; Luella Rasmussen (Dick) of Omaha; and Frank Stinn (Mary Ann) of Tinley Park, IL; 30 grandchildren; 55 great grandchildren; three great-great grandchildren and other relatives.

A Mass of Christian Burial was concelebrated Dec. 1, 1997, at St. Joseph's Catholic Church in Earling, with Rev. Wayne Gubbels celebrant and Rev. Michael Berner homilist and Rev.
