

## Virgia Urban, 92

**WALNUT** — Virgia Margueretta Urban, daughter of John and Florence Carspecken Archer was born July 7, 1894 at Oakland. She attended school in Oakland and Avoca and later taught a country school east of Avoca.

On Jan. 7, 1914, she married Harry Buttenschon of Walnut at Co. Bluffs. They farmed south of Walnut until his death in 1933. She then moved to Co. Bluffs where she was administrator of the Creche Orphanage.

On Oct. 6, 1934, she married Ed Urban of Papillion, NE. They made their home on a farm near Wyoming, IA. She was active in Jones county health work and was a member of the Rebeka Lodge, the Progressive club and the Best Yette club in Jones county. In 1958, they moved to Walnut so she could take care of her aging parents. Her husband, Ed Urban, died Sept. 5, 1970. On March 6, 1987, she died at her home, following a week's illness at age 92 years.

She was preceded in death by her parents; her two husbands and her youngest sister, Velma Archer. Surviving are her sister, Violet Clough of Walnut; a number of nieces, nephews and other relatives.

Funeral services for Vergia Archer were held at the Berthusen-Knutson Funeral Home at Walnut on March 9, 1987 with Rev. Harvey Beach of the United Presbyterian church in Walnut, officiating. Casketbearers were Herbert Mertz, George Mertz, Eldon Michaelsen, Gary Michaelsen, Robert Lafrentz and Craig Woltmann. Burial was in the Walnut cemetery.
