

George R. Weber, 72

MANNING – George Raymond Weber, son of William Herman and Freda (Jensen) Weber, was born near Poplar, Nov. 14, 1927. He was baptized at the United Methodist Church in Irwin where he was a lifetime member. He attended country school in the Poplar area until 1934, Lincoln No. 9 through eighth grade and attended Audubon High School, graduating in 1946. After graduation he worked for one winter at the Omaha Stockyards in Omaha.

He married Irma Fairchild, Feb. 27, 1949 at the Methodist Church in Gray. They became the parents of four children. They farmed in various locations in the Audubon and Shelby County area until 1961, when they moved to the farm on which they are presently located. George retired in January of 1993, but remained active in farming with his sons. He died May 14, 2000, at the Audubon County Hospital at age 72 years and six months.

In addition to his parents, George was preceded in death by his sister Margie Johansen, his brother-in-law, Roland Adams and his nephew Jerry Adams.
