I don't mix with these guys here very well and when I go some where I like to go in a decent place and a decent bunch of people. I would buy a motorcycle if I thought ~~it~~, I mean if I knew how long I would be on this detail. If the law is passed to wreck 740 more camps I am going to get a bycycle or something. I first started this letter because Bailey asks  
me to come & see him and get a blank  
for application for a 10 day leave. He  
couldn't say when I would get it, but any  
time would be welcome. He isn't the  
one who has authority to grant a  
leave anyhow. It must go through  
the office & have some officer to sign  
it.
